New Product - Initialed Mugs

A nice gift for you or someone special: a mug personalized with your initial. Each mug is a collaborative effort between me and the kiln, so each one is absolutely unique—just like you.

Your mug will hold about 12 ounces and bear a darkblue-to-black raised initial surrounded by a border of raised dots. The liner glaze will be blue, with or without lighter blue dots on the outside. The rest is up to the kiln! The background will have some rustorange, perhaps some silver, cream, or charcoal.
